Legislative Alert:

Immediate Action Needed on HB 1101 / SB 1842

Dear FMHCA Network,

We need your voice now.

House Bill 1101(2025), introduced by Representative Jon Albert, and its companion **Senate Bill 1842**, would require health care providers (as defined in Chapter 456 – which includes LMHCs) to notify patients in writing when referring them to out-of-network providers.

While the intent of this legislation is to enhance transparency in healthcare referrals, it shifts the burden of notification from insurance companies to healthcare providers. This creates significant administrative strain on providers, particularly those in private practice, and may result in delays in care unless additional staff are hired to research patient insurance status—an unsustainable expectation for many.

Key Concerns:

- Increased administrative workload for providers
- Potential delays in patient care
- Financial strain on small or solo practices
- Failure to comply, without good cause, may result in disciplinary action against the provider

What You Can Do: Please contact (call and/or email) your Florida State Representative and State Senator (not your U.S. Congressman) and express your concerns about this legislation. You are encouraged to personalize your message with a brief explanation of how this bill could affect your practice or the patients you serve.
